You recently wrote to the First Minister with the following Written Assembly Question:

Will the First Minister make a statement on the future of the Welsh Government Civil Service Board and its various sub-committees?

As this question relates to the operation of the Welsh Government, the First Minister has asked me to respond to you directly.

The Welsh Government's Board is an essential part of the organisation's internal corporate-decision making structures – I particularly value the Board for the excellent advice and challenge current members provide me as Principal Accounting Officer to the Welsh Government. I reviewed the Board's terms of reference shortly after I joined the organisation last year, and updated them in light of the launch of the Government's *National Strategy – Prosperity for All*. I am in the process of appointing some new Non-Executive Directors to the Board and look forward to the perspectives and experience they will bring.

The Permanent Secretary's views on the effectiveness of the Welsh Government's governance arrangements, including the operation of the Board and its sub-committees, are published each year in the Welsh Government's Annual Accounts and scrutinised by the Public Accounts Committee.
